* Hope Academy of West Michigan began the 2020-2021 school year on a hybrid schedule in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. Elementary students grades Pre-K - 5 returned to face-to-face instruction full-time on August 5, 2020 and remained on in-person learning until November 11, 2020 at which time the transmission and infection rates for Covid-19 were too high to ensure the safety and well-being of students, families, and staff members.

Secondary students in grades 6-12 began the school year on August 5, 2020 on a hybrid schedule with students attending either an AM session or a PM session, each with four hours of direct instruction in their core classes of ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies and two hours of virtual learning using the Edgenuity platform. Secondary students continued on this hybrid schedule until November 11, 2020, at which time the school was placed on a full-time remote learning schedule to control for the transmission and high positivity rates within the school building and the community.

On January 11, 2021 Preschool – 9th grade students returned to full-time face-to-face direct instruction and grades 10-12 returned to either an AM or PM session with four hours of direct instruction in their core classes of ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies and two hours of virtual learning using the Edgenuity Platform and/or IXL test prep class for PSAT or SAT.
